
EMRP Call 2007 Call Scope

The Call for Expressions of Interest opens four specific areas of the 2007 edition of the European Metrology Research Programme – the "EMRP Edition 2007" – as follows:

- 1) TP1 'SI and Fundamental': Expressions of Interest related to collaborative Joint Research Projects contributing to a Targeted Programme for research in metrology addressing the possible redefinition of the *S* and associated work on the fundamental constants, as defined in III.2.1 "Grand Challenges on fundamental metrology" of the EMRP
Note: In addition mathematical/computational tools as defined under the "Mathematics and ICT for metrology" in section of III.2.2 that are directly related to or underpin III.2.1 will be considered to be in scope "
- 2) TP2 'Health': Expressions of Interest related to collaborative Joint Research Projects contributing to a Targeted Programme for research in metrology for health, as defined in III.1 "Health"
Note: In addition those topics defined in III.2.2. "Ionising Radiation", and in "Metrology in Chemistry", or any other areas of the EMRP that are directly and primarily aimed at supporting the "health" sector will be considered to be in scope.
- 3) TP3 'Length': Expressions of Interest related to collaborative Joint Research Projects contributing to a Targeted Programme for research in dimensional/length metrology as defined in III.2.2 "Length"
Note: In addition topics defined in III.1. "New Technologies" that are directly and primarily related to dimensional metrology will be considered to be in scope
- 4) TP4 'Electricity and Magnetism': Expressions of Interest related to collaborative Joint Research Projects contributing to a Targeted Programme for research in electromagnetic metrology as defined in III.2.2 "Electricity and Magnetism"
Note: In addition topics defined in III.1. "New Technologies" that are directly and primarily related to Electricity and Magnetism will be considered to be in scope.

Further details of each specific area is given in "EMRP Edition 2007".

No other areas of the EMRP are open for Expressions of Interest at this time.
